They are neither friends nor lovers.
She will eat neither fast food nor cake.

Do you usually take a bus or walk to school?
Do you eat with chopsticks or a fork?

Do you want to eat ice cream now or later?
Do you want tea or coffee?





CONJUNCTIONS SWITCHIT RULES

1. Deal 7 cards to each player.
2. Place the pack facedown, turn the top card and put it by the pack.
3. Players in turn play a card, which matches the conjunction or color of the top card and then complete the statement or question.
4. A special Switchit card, can't be your last card, changes the color or conjunction of the next card, played by the next player, to be played.
5. A player who cannot play takes a card from the pack.
6. The object of the game is to get rid of all your cards.
7. Remove pack after a winner is found and continue playing.
